Dear fellow Republican,

A former federal prosecutor and U.S. Justice Department trial attorney with a Northern Neck family history dating 358 years, she now practices law in White Stone. She's a graduate of Lancaster High School, The College of William and Mary in Virginia, and The University of Virginia Law School. She's involved in a number of community activities – such as serving on The Lancaster Players and the YMCA Camp Kekoka boards of directors, and as a citizen member of the Northern Neck Chesapeake Bay Public Access Authority.

Lee Anne is pure Northern Neck. Her father, the late George Clifford Washington, a waterman and president of the Virginia Waterman's Association, for more than 30 years represented his fellow watermen with the Virginia General Assembly in Richmond. Her great-great-grandfather, the late Joseph Ball Cralle, was a local builder and business man who founded *The Rappahannock Record*. Her great-grandfather, the late George Washington Sanders, a White Stone merchant, was the second president of The People's Bank of White Stone and the town's first Mayor, and he served as Lancaster County's treasurer. A portion of the Washington family's ancestral farm still exists as forestland within White Stone's town limits.

As a lifelong Republican, Lee Anne is firm in her political philosophy of limited government, lower taxes and curtailed government spending, and elimination of needless and overly intrusive government regulations and mandates. She is pro-life upholds the institution of marriage, the constitutional right to bear arms, private property rights, elimination of illegal immigration, and protection of the environment.
